CHESS NEWS

August and September - The Glendal chess team participated in three Chess Victoria zonal tournaments and three Northern Star zonal tournaments. Twenty-five students played including Deethya, Seyon, Bruce, Max, Sophia, Zekai, David, Ricky, Gautam, Ashar, Om, William, Jack, Stephanie, Aadhya, Swaraa, Dheera, An, Hai, Kaylin, Vishan, Bianca, Joanna, Nicholas and Siddharth. They won one trophy and came second at NSC events, came third twice in the Chess Victoria tournaments and qualified to compete in the Chess Victoria secondary state final. This year there are 19 students who have qualified for the NSC open state semifinal and seven students who have qualified for the NSC girls state final. The children have qualified four times for the Chess Victoria state final open and once for Chess Victoria girls' state final and secondary open state final.

More highlights:

- 4th August Chess Victoria tournament at Mount Waverley North Primary School:
 Glendal achieved 3rd and 5th places and qualified for the Chess Victoria state final. Aadhya, Sophia, Kaylin, Joanna and Dheera gained 22.5 points.
- 9th August Chess Victoria at Balwyn North Primary School:
 Glendal achieved 3rd place. Max, Zekai, Bruce, Bianca and Seyon gained 21.5 points.
- 30th August Northern Star at St Bridget's Primary School:
 Glendal achieved 1st place. Max, Ricky, Gautam and An gained 23 points.
 Ricky won the trophy, Max received gold in Year 5-6, Gautam received bronze in Foundation to 2, Bianca received gold for girls, Sophia received silver for girls and Joanna received bronze for girls.
- 5th September Chess Victoria secondary at Camberwell Grammar School:
 Glendal achieved 10th place. Max, Deethya, Zekai, Gautam and William gained 20.5 points and qualified for the Chess Victoria state final secondary school division.
- 13th September Northern Star at Doncaster Gardens Primary School:
 Glendal achieved 2nd place. Deethya, Bianca, Sophia and Aadhya gained 20.5 points.
 Deethya received gold for girls, Bianca received gold for Foundation to 2, Sophia received silver for girls,
 Aadhya received bronze for girls and Jack received bronze for Year 3-4.

Deethya won the individual trophy with a score of 6.5/7, Bianca and Aadhya gained 5 points each, Joanna, Swaraa, Sophia and Kaylin all gained 4 points and Stephanie 1.5 points. The comic book project was an amazing way to learn more and more vocabulary in Chinese. It also enhanced my knowledge about sentence structure and grammar. - Dabria 6M


It was an enjoyable project, as we were able to to clash art with Chinese, and it was a very enjoyable fairy tale to do for our final year. - Tanya 6M

















YEAR 4 CAMP - ARRABRI LODGE

Come and join in the fun of learning to play keyboard, guitar, here at Glendal Primary School.


Creative Music for Schools conducts a music program here at school each week.
